# **Wrist Ganglion Cyst**



#### What is it?

Benign lumps which form under the skin, near to joints or tendons, usually on the wrists or fingers.

#### What causes it?

Injury to joint capsule and/or tendon sheath or surrounding tissue

## **Symptoms**

Swellings/lumps which can vary in size. At times, weakness and/or pain in wrist.

## Top Tips

Seek medical advice as to severity and best course of treatment

# How to Treat it

Ice. Anti-inflammatories and/or painkillers.



#### Rehab

Aspiration by medical professional. Rest, if painful.

# **Definitions**

Ganglion Cyst – abnormal sac or cavity containing fluid, usually near a joint

Benign - non-cancerous

Tendon sheath - membrane around a tendon, allowing the tendon to stretch without adhering to surrounding connective tissues

Joint capsule - an envelope surrounding the joint, made up of an outer fibrous layer and an inner synovial layer secreting lubricating fluid

**Aspiration** – the draining of matter from the body
